



Updates & Reminders

- Our Medical Advisory Committe has approved adding an additional 2 team members for each team, bringing the maximum number of team members to 14.
- Please bring 2 weeks of your personal medications with you to Honduras to ensure you have enough should you experience flight delays or the need to quarantine.
- In the event of cancelled flights, FOB reserves the right to rebook volunteers as the organization sees best, taking both cost and schedule into account.
- Our policy is that you are masked while in direct contact with community members. Please adhere to this policy, and certainly do not take or post photos of yourself unmasked with children in the community.
- KN95 masks are required while in contact with patients in clinics. We understand that these can be hot, so please take mask breaks outside while practicing social distancing when needed.
- An at home COVID test taken the day before your departure to Honduras is <u>required by FOB</u>. If you need a test, a third round of 8 free covid tests are available through COVID.gov/tests
